

On Sunday Aug 11, 6:00 – 8:30 p.m., Robert & Barbara McOwen will present a class giving a historical perspective on Scottish Country Dancing. In particular, traditional dances will be taught containing formations that are at variance with the current RSCDS versions. Aspects of the music may also be discussed: Its traditions over the last 300 years, and changes within the last century.

Robert began Scottish country and highland dancing in
Berkeley in 1973. He received the RSCDS Teaching Certificate
by examination in Scotland in 1980, and since then
has taught at dance camps and workshops across the United States,
and in Canada, Scotland, Japan, New Zealand, and Australia.
He has taught, competed in, and performed
highland dancing at various events across the United States,
including Bonnie Rideout's "Scottish Christmas" Tour 1999–2005.
Since 1979, he has been an active member of the Boston
Branch of the RSCDS.

Barbara is among the founders of the Scottish Dance musicians' communities on both coasts of the United States. She has founded and directed many iconic bands over the years, including The Berkeley Scottish Players, Tullochgorum, The Strathspey & Reel Society of New Hampshire, and the Carfuffle Ceilidh Band.
